HORTICULTURAL

Flower Show Trophy best in the Horticultural Section

40th Anniversary Cup best 3 identical daffodils in Classes 1 or 2

- 1. 3 daffodils, trumpets as long or longer than petals
- 2. 3 daffodils, trumpets less than length of petals
- 3. 3 narcissi, excluding poeticus types
- 4. Poeticus narcissi small eye (e.g. Actaea, Pheasant Eye)
- 5. 3 daffodils, doubles
- 6. 3 narcissi, more than one flower per stem
- 7. Vase of narcissi/daffodils, not more than 10 stems
- 8. Vase of narcissi/daffodils, dwarf / miniature varieties, no more than 6 stems
- 9. 3 tulips, any variety
- 10. 6 stems polyanthus
- 11. Vase of Spring flowers (not shrubs) exc. daffodils and narcissi
- 12. Vase of shrubs in bloom, height max. 71 cm from bench, dia. max. 51 cm
- 13. Pot or bowl of bulbs, any variety, max 3
- 14. Flowering pot plant (not bulbs) dia. max. 30 cm
- 15. Foliage pot plant dia. max. 30 cm
- 16. Any vegetable (one kind). (Ask Secretaries quantity required)
- 17. 3 sticks of rhubarb with 5/7.5 cm leaf left on
- 18. Patio pot containing Spring flowers. Pot dia. max. 25 cm

- 19. "OUT OF THE BOX" an exhibit using flowers and foliage to include a lidded box Max. width 60cms.
- 20. "SPRING IS IN THE AIR" an arrangement using flowers and foliage. Max width 45 cms.
- 21. "PETITE" an exhibit using flowers and foliage. Max. width/dim 10 cms.
- 22. "CHEERS!" (for men only) an exhibit using foliage and/or flowers. Max. width/dim 30 cms.

Recipe for Lemon Drizzle Cake (Class 29)

Ingredients:	175g unsalted butter, softened	175g caster sugar
	3 large eggs	Finely grated zest of
	175g self-raising flour	2 lemons

Topping:Juice of 2 lemons110g caster sugar

Method: Preheat oven to 180° C (Fan 160° C) or gas mark 4. Beat together butter and sugar until pale and creamy then add the eggs one at a time slowly mixing through. Sift the flour then add the lemon zest and mix until well combined. Line a loaf tin (8 x 21 cm) with greaseproof paper, then spoon in the mixture and level the top with a spoon. Bake for 45-50 mins until a thin skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. While cake is cooling in the tin, mix together the lemon juice and sugar to make the drizzle. Prick the warm cake all over with a skewer or fork, then pour over the drizzle. Leave in the tin until completely cool.

Recipe for Malteser Traybake (Class 30)

 Ingredients:
 Melt together
 100g butter

 200g milk chocolate
 3 tblspn golden syrup

 then add
 225g digestive biscuits (finely crushed)

 225g Maltesers

Mix together quickly then pour into a lined Swiss roll tin and chill until set. Cut into squares and display 3 on a tea plate.

Under 13 years of age on the day of the event - age should be stated on entry, which will be taken into account in judging etc. All entries should be the children's own unassisted work.

- 45. Make a vehicle using a cardboard box no bigger than 40cms
- 46. A drawing or painting of an animal (A4 size)
- 47. Decorate digestive biscuits 3 on a tea plate
- 48. An item of handicraft (max. dim. 25cms)
- 49.. UP TO 5 YEARS colour in an Easter egg (ask Secretaries for outline)
- 50. GROUP ENTRY build a SCARECROW max. width (ie fingertip to fingertip) 122 cms max. height 152 cms. It must be free-standing; we suggest using a cross for the frame and then supporting it in a patio umbrella stand. <u>The</u> winning scarecrow's clothing cannot be returned so please make sure you use garments you have finished with. - 1. Participation is restricted to exhibitors who are Scaynes Hill residents, or from members of the various village organisations who live beyond the Parish boundaries.
- 2. No exhibitor shall make more than one entry per class. All horticultural exhibits must be the bona fide property of and grown by the exhibitor, except in some Floral Art classes.
- 3. The Village Centre will be open from 9 a.m. on the morning of the Show and ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 11.00 a.m. when everyone except Show Officials will be asked to leave so that judging can take place. The Judges' decisions will be final.
- 4. All ordinary care will be taken of exhibitors' property, but no responsibility can be accepted for any loss or damage.
- 5. Exhibits not intended for auction are to be removed between 3.45 4.00 p.m. please.
