## Flower Show Trophy best in the Horticultural Section

### 40th Anniversary Cup best 3 identical daffodils in Classes 1 or 2

- 1. 3 daffodils, trumpets as long or longer than petals
- 2. 3 daffodils, trumpets less than length of petals
- 3. Withdrawn
- 4. Poeticus narcissi small eye (e.g. Actaea, Pheasant Eye)
- 5. 3 daffodils, doubles
- 6. 3 daffodils, more than one flower per stem
- 7. Vase of narcissi/daffodils, not more than 10 stems
- 8. Vase of narcissi/daffodils, dwarf / miniature varieties, no more than 6 stems
- 9. 3 tulips, any variety
- 10. 6 stems polyanthus
- 11. Vase of Spring flowers (not shrubs) exc. daffodils and narcissi
- 12. Vase of shrubs in bloom, height max. 71 cm from bench, dia. max. 51 cm
- 13. Pot or bowl of bulbs, any variety, max 3
- 14. Flowering pot plant (not bulbs) dia. max. 30 cm
- 15. Foliage pot plant dia. max. 30 cm
- 16. Any vegetable (one kind). (Ask Secretaries quantity required)
- 17. 3 sticks of rhubarb with 5/7.5 cm leaf left on
- 18. Patio pot containing Spring flowers. Pot dia. max. 25 cm

- 19. An arrangement in an unusual container. Max.width 50cms.

#### Recipe for Chocolate Fudge Cake (Class 29)

**Ingredients:** 2 eggs 150mls sunflower oil 150mls milk 2 tablspns golden syrup 150gs castor sugar

185gs plain flour 25gs sifted cocoa

1 tspn baking powder 1 tspn bicarbonate soda

**Topping:** 75gs milk chocolate 75gs butter

60gs sifted icing sugar 1 chocolate flake

**Method:** Put eggs, oil, milk, syrup, sugar, flour, cocoa, baking powder and bicarbonate soda into bowl. Beat well for 2 minutes. Spoon into greased & base lined 20cm tin and cook at 160 degrees for one hour or until skewer inserted in middle of cake comes out clean. Turn onto rack, peel off paper and cool. Melt chocolate in bowl. Beat butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Stir in melted chocolate. Cool slightly until thickened. Spoon over top of cake. Decorate with pieces of flake. Store in air-tight tin for up to one week.

#### Recipe for Uncooked Chocolate Squares (Class 30)

**Ingredients:** Melt together 225gs margarine

1 tblspn golden syrup

1 tblspn cocoa 1 tblspn sugar

then add 225gs crushed digestive biscuits

75gs sultanas

Mix together then pour into a lined tin 18 cms x 23 cms, set in the fridge then cover with 110gs melted chocolate and return to fridge to set. Cut into squares and display 3 on a tea plate.

- 45. 'Mr Potatoe Head' no bigger than 15 cms any dimension
- 46. A decorated bookmark.
- 47. A Duplo or Lego model. Max. dimension 25cms (not a kit)
- 48. A face mask on a paper plate.
- 49.. **UP TO 5 YEARS** paint a rainbow in any medium (A4 size)
- 50. **GROUP ENTRY** build a **SCARECROW** max. width (ie fingertip to fingertip) 122 cms max. height 152 cms. It must be free-standing; we suggest using a cross for the frame and then supporting it in a patio umbrella stand. The winning scarecrow's clothing cannot be returned so please make sure you use garments you have finished with. If you have any questions please contact Angela on 01444 831599

- 5. Exhibits not intended for auction are to be removed between 3.45 4.00 p.m. please.
